Odyssey Charter rolls out COVID testing

Thanks to the incredible efforts of our nursing department, Odyssey has successfully started rapid antigen testing.

The testing program at Odyssey has been occurring for the last four weeks, as we strategically return to hybrid learning. Safety is always first, so we are making every effort to ensure our students can return to school safely. Our initial testing has yielded promising data, with 99.25% of students testing negative and 100% of staff testing negative. As more promising data becomes available, we will be looking to safely increase the number of students we are welcoming back to campus.




We would like to sincerely thank all our counselors for their efforts to support our students. Our counselors work to ensure the social emotional well being of our students and their academic success. Cheers

On the week of 01/25 7th grade returns. We have 88 students returning between both cohorts. **That is 50.3% of our seventh grade**.

On the week of 02/01 8th grade returns. We have 84 students returning between both cohorts. **That is 47% of our seventh grade.**

IM: IS: On our opening day, Tuesday, January 19th, 49 students signed up and 44/49 attended. Of those 5 who did not attend, 1 did not have their COVID test completed and did not return/attended online. The other students attended virtually. Our third-grade total for both cohorts is ~50%.

We are looking forward to bringing back ~41% of our 4th graders signed up for the week of 1/25 and 54% of our 5th graders signed up for the week of 2/1.

LS: On Monday, 49 of 53 registered COHORT A Kindergarten students attend in person. On Thursday, 44 of 47 registered COHORT B Kindergarten students attend as well as 1 non-kindergarten student with complex needs.

Of the 7 Kindergarten absences, only 1 was related to the absence of a negative COVID test

Therefore, this week the lower school welcomed back approximately 51% of the total Kindergarten grade to the building.

We look forward to opening our doors to 1st Grade next week and 2nd Grade the week of 2/1.

Meeting with Board	OCS was certified as a testing center within 24 hours of the application being submitted. Testing for staff occurs Mon, Tues, Thurs, Fri Testing for students occurs each wednesday for the cohort returning the following week Current Challenge: Establishing our school as a long term certified testing center. Currently we are authorized for one round of testing. Once we are certified, we will create a protocol around the frequency of testing, most likely every 2-3 weeks, but also targeted on infection rates in each building. In other words, testing frequency could increase in a building if the infection rate is higher. I am working with Kendall Massett from the charter school division to create a partnership with a clinic that would certify our school. Kendall said not to worry too much because she feels confident we will forge this relationship. We also have reached out to community members who are physicians for support as well. Created a Calndly schedule and opened up time for one week to have 1 on 1 appointments with Board members, and scheduled another the week after.
