This program offers unvaccinated close contacts the ability for families to take them to testing each night and attend school the next day. This program is operated at the state level.  Odyssey Nursing is responsible for identifying participants, explaining the process, and reviewing the results submitted by families. Testing availability and locations is decided at a state level.  Close Contact Information:  Nurses are reaching out to close contacts (Students/Staff) as they are identifying them. This close contact information may be shared via email or telephone call. Nursing is doing their best to identify close contact in a timely manner. At times notification of a positive case is happening as the close contact window has closed. Due to the notification process of close contacts the entire community should be monitoring for signs/symptoms of COVID-19.
