

Minutes for Public Meeting of the Odyssey Board of Directors

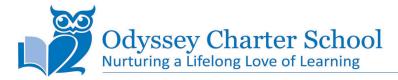



- 3. Standard Order of Business
 - Previous minutes October 21 and November 17th, December 3rd, and December 8th presented
 - o Motion to Approve minutes as amended AA 1st and EA 2nd
 - Approved unanimously
 - Head of School Report Elias Pappas
 - Covid update
 - Odyssey Charter Covid Dashboard updated as of 12/3
 - a. 128 Positive cases, 44 positive cases on campus testing
 - b. Please don't send your kids to school sick
 - We are in the Test to Stay program, which gets unvaccinated close contacts back in school more quickly and safely.
 - d. Highly recommend vaccination and will have another vaccination clinic after the break.
 - e. Quidel testing is occurring every other week, and can change as needed.



- Fundraising the Flagpole Fundraising. We are beginning phase 2 with focus on the next building. Mike Russo will be spearheading the next phase. Our goal for this phase will be \$50,000.
- Bleachers and scoreboard are on the way, just need to be installed
 Culture Focus We now have a culture coordinator
 - Staff surveys are already out and parent surveys will come out shortly
 - Scheduled culture walkthroughs will begin shortly as well
- Food Service Providing nourishing meals for 1,400 students per day. We are looking to expand our kitchen to meet our growing needs.
- Facilities Office and support personnel move is close to completion, allowing the staff to be more centrally located.
- IT Formatting new 150 Chromebooks, Schoology rollover has occurred.
- Lower School Preparing for the winter concerts, and Winter Olympic Door
 Decorating after winter break. Teacher walkthroughs are focused on inclusion
 and equitable learning. Continuing work from our Trauma Informed Practices PD
- o Intermediate School Door decorating is underway, the 3rd grade is having an inhouse field trip. Third grade holiday concert is coming up.
- Middle School Penny Wars starts for the drama department. Eight grade is selling cookie dough for their end of the year trip, formal, and graduation. MS Band winter concert is Dec 15th. S.T.E.A.M. gingerbread workshop is Dec 22nd.
- Curriculum Update: I-Ready Kindergarten Math Screener is ready for assessments in January. K-5 teachers have received a plethora of intervention strategies.
 Teachers are exploring 5 reading curriculums, and additional professional development is being planned for the remainder of the year.
- High School College applications have begun, with 23 students applying to 125 college so far. We have acceptances from Penn State, Temple, Jefferson, and others. Masquerade Ball will be Jan 14th, marking the end of the first semester. Greek trip will be through EF Tours in 2023. 8th graders toured as part of our Step Up program.
- Enrollment we are looking at next year's models and projections
 - DEI Priorities training will continue
- o Visual Branding Pricing banner and lighting for the front entrance of the LS



- Transportation We are going to purchase a used bus asap. We are taking over Bus 5 as soon as we have a bus and driver. New Talley Day park stop will begin after the break. Discussions regarding Delaware spec requirements for buses, and costs of retrofitting. Timing for new, used, or leased busses.
- O Student services Working on our inclusive model. WIDA testing in the new year. Problem solving team in each school is meeting to identify students needing assistance. SEL program has become a priority for K-2 with social emotional regulation, to identify common language to support consistency throughout the school. Spec-Ed is working on training, and the first Parent Council for Students with Disabilities is in December, please look for a flyer with details.

LS: No imminent Requests





5. Good of the school

- Elias Pappas Covid rates are increasing
 - o Some schools are considering virtual starts after winter break
 - o Admin is suggesting virtual school for January 4, 5, 6, and 7
 - o Due to family gatherings and travel over break
 - o At school testing would be made available for student and staff
 - Teachers would be at school
 - o Discussion covered topics like testing before returning on Jan 4, students who had not yet done remote learning, availability of hardware, and what are the specific numbers of increase. Does the team feel virtual week will be productive, what testing requirements we can enforce, how many can we test, 75% of our students have agreements to be tested. Can parents handle an additional week at home, what are our vaccination rates like for our students, what is the impact to the learning abilities with another week of virtual. Impact on the families for coverage at home. Vaccination data is difficult to gather due to reporting process, we are pushing mitigation strategies. Is there value in a family survey for vax status or even appointments scheduled, where are cases spiking, what age brackets. Will learning be asynchronous, so assignments would be needed to loaded in advance. Does board need to approve closing like this. Is there enough time to create packets. Could we be in-person with optional virtual. Is Quidel available. Most schools are returning in-person.
 - Please put together anonymous survey to gather vaccination status/plans for students so we can get some data to make an informed decision on virtual learning for January 4-7 based on that.
