Delaware Public Health is partnering with Quidel to offer testing in Delaware Schools.

Staff and Student Families are required to reach out to their building level RN for guidance when testing positive or someone within their home is positive.

Test to Stay: Delaware Public Health has closed Test to Stay at this time.

Please DO NOT send children to school ill. There is a rise in other illnesses on campus. We are currently experiencing multiple cases of Influenza, RSV, Strep throat and colds. Please keep your child home if they are ill. Students should not come to school if they have had a fever in the last 24 hours.

Vaccination is highly recommended to prevent the spread of COVID.

Students and Staff are continuing with the 10 day quarantine period. Isolation at home for the first 5 days. On day 6-10 they may return to campus and must wear masks at all times except when eating.

Close contacts are no longer notified unless they reside within the same household.

Plan for Spring Break:

Odyssey had applied to DPH to obtain one free take home test for every student and staff member. Ideally these tests would be given out on the last day on campus before Spring break. Students and staff would use their test at home prior to return to campus.

Financial Update	 The Transportation Department has been awarded a \$26k federal grant to assist driver retention. Final portion of the CSD Settlement funds received in Local District Transfers. Annual Appeal and Athletics Golf Outing Fundraisers are underway. Adjustments in volume variable programming explained in the Final Budget process. To-date, \$1.2mill of expenses have been coded to Federal funds out of the preliminary budgeted amount of \$1.96mill. The projected year-end cash on hand is \$8.4million, of which \$6.9mill is unrestricted (not including State 2% contingency) and \$1.5mill is restricted for federal funds.
