

### o Middle School


- Hiring continues

# Transportation

### Student Services

- Working with students and staff to identify student needs and address them
- Special ed student scheduling is being reviewed
- o Hiring six new secondary special ed teachers for this school year
- o IEP students will have a class to support direct instruction in their IEP goal

- o Campus network switches have been replaced with new Meraki gear
- Copiers, projectors, smart boards, wifi, paging, and camera systems are all underway in building 26
- Chromebooks orders have been delayed. Probably no new Chromebooks for grades 3,6,9. We will replace when the new ones arrive.

#### o Facilities


- Prepping building 26 has been much of the summer

- All front doors and glass will be laminated with a film to limit entry through broken glass panes.
- ALICE safety training will be September 16<sup>th</sup> for all staff. This is for active shooter situations, and what techniques and strategies to use.


### General Questions and Answers

- eSchool training has been provided to other admin staff to speed entry


## Greek Program – Dr. Ioanna Lekkakou

- Training with the Delaware Institute for Administrators, organized by the DOE,
   with multistate immersion programs covered a variety of topics
- The Annual Delaware Immersion Institute in August will have all our new Greek teachers participating.
- Working to make sure the new Lower School building is ready
- o Preparing to welcome and acclimate the new teachers arriving from Greece
- Continuing the curriculum planning and existing collaborations with other school and universities
- Building new collaborations with: Patakis Publishers, the largest publishing house in Greece, Citizen Tales Common to host a Greek poet, and more immersion programs in the US
- o Four teachers in the high school will help assimilate the new students and introduce them to the Greek culture and program.
