


- o 4th Grade DeSSA Social Studies Field Test are this week

Curriculum Instruction and Assessment

- Amplify material arrived on Oct 14th, we are working with Amplify staff to complete walkthroughs and answering questions and concerns
- HB 198 Black History curriculum implementation has been compiled, vetted, and approved. It will shared with the DOE on Monday.

- Digital SAT study was completed, Nov 10, with 83% participation

Human Resources


- o Special Ed and all staff positions have been filled, or are scheduled to be so



 - o Lower school teachers have begun preparing winter songs

 - Monthly finance report October
 - Preliminary budget revenues of \$41,376,294, with 65.6% collected
 - \$400,000 decrease in state funds due to lower than budgeted unit count, additional income of \$600,000 local funding from last fiscal year


- Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion –Eva Jannelli, Paula Lowe
 - The outreach program had the fourth OCS food drive this week to provide canned goods and turkeys to families in our OCS community.
 - o Fourteen baskets have been requested from our food pantry
 - We have also provided coats and meet the needs our families
 - Our students, the honor society, technology club, and others have stepped up to provide support
- Immersion Annamarie Anagnostou
 - Meeting second Wednesday of every month to help grow the Greek program
- Finance Committee Jeff Koss
 - o The investors, based on our solid financial performance has suggested moving from quarterly to annual meeting. This is a testament to our stability.
- Fundraising Committee Jeff Koss
 - We are looking for assistance as we work on planning events and finding additional funding resources.



- Accountability Committee Erin Allard
 - We are looking to get a pulse of the school. We will work on an anonymous engagement survey for the staff to measure areas of where we need to focus. To hear what excites them about OCS, how we can support them, and what challenges they may have
 - Gathering candid feedback will provide us data on what our action plans will be and what we need to address
 - We are reviewing our plans for parent and staff involvement, and how we can protect confidentiality as needed.

 - There were discussion about additional entrances or exits from the campus. The
 costs, limits, and neighbors are all factors to be considered, as well as the DOT and
 legal impact. It will be part of the strategic planning
 - There was discussion about the lower school fire alarm. Evacuation went smoothly; students were moved to another building. We committed to a reunification to dismiss students early. DEMA will work with us on an after-action report.

- Grants Update Jeff Koss
 - Covid related grants ESSER III grant has 24 months remaining. Used for an ELL coordinator, CIA coordinator, Chromebook refresh, summer recovery program, additional paraprofessionals, 6-12 ELA curriculum, and HVAC maintenance. These helped our students recover from learning loss, these costs will become part of our future planning budget. Going forward will continue evaluate going forward
 - DE Charter School Expansion Grant Budget items include K-5 Amplify, High school elevator, HS entrance renovation, additional Chromebook, furniture, and other supplies. Grant began October 1st and ends Sept 30, 2023.
 - High school elevator was prioritized due to the 2 floor programming of students schedules in the building
