#### HB 198

 Members of the CIA Team attended a sharing session in Dover on Wednesday, October 19th regarding the HB 198 implementation. As a school, we are documenting what we are currently teaching and noting what changes need to be made in our current curriculum K-12 to address the inequities regarding Black History. ## **Professional Development**

 I-Ready training occurred with middle school teachers October 7th. Teachers planned how to use data based on their diagnostic test.

- Digital SAT Suite In-School Study to be completed on November 10th, 2022 with 10th and 11th graders.
  - Representatives from DOE will be coming to observe our administration
  - Will receive about \$2500+ from participating in this study
- DeSSA Test Security Training is being monitored to ensure completion by 10/31.
- AP Exams to be ordered by 11/15.
- DeSSA SS Through-Year Assessments to begin in November for grades 4, 6, and 8.

#### **Financial Update**

- The annual financial statement and single audit were submitted to the State by the due date of October 1st. Odyssey had it's third straight year without any findings and met every bond covenant and State metric.
- Local Funding preloads from four districts were received during September. The preloads represent 35% of the payables owed from the District to each Charter School. The remaining districts are expected to roll in over the next month, followed by the final distribution after the completion of the unit count process.
- The September 30th Unit Count for OCS finalized at 2,123, representing 99.5% of the charter approval amount and 99.1% of the preliminary budgeted amount.
- The State had an error identified in the preliminary charter and choice bills. The corrected rates will be used for the final charter and choice bills, so all final amounts will be reconciled against what was paid on the preload. As it stands, projecting local revenue from districts to exceed preliminary budget by approximately \$600k. An in-depth breakdown will be completed during October as well as the forward-looking cash projection.

- OCS will be creating and submitting tuition tax bills for the previous fiscal year and projected next fiscal year. Submission is due by November 15th.
- In transportation, an increase in contracted routes have resulted in increased expenses and increased associated revenue. Future projections will include the potential impact.
- To-date, \$440k of expenses have been coded to Federal funds out of the preliminary budgeted amount of \$1.8mill.

# Fundraising/ Development

- In the process of hiring a Development Specialist that will complete, coordinate, and administer future events, solicitations, and administrative functions.
- Planning for Gala 2.0 is underway, targeting May 6, 2023 as a potential date.
- Continuing our partnership with the Philadelphia 76ers, we finalized the details on a fundraiser on November 2nd at the game between the 76ers and Washington Wizards. The success of last year's event will be built upon for seamless logistics, varying price points, and an accompanying raffle for the event. The goal is to raise \$10k for school programming. Over 200 tickets have been sold thus far! Let's fill the stadium! Our goal is 600 tickets sold!
- The Health and Wellness Fair Committee has had a preliminary meeting and is targeting a date of April 29th. More information to come as well as peer-to-peer fundraising efforts to partner with nonprofits and primarily fundraise for the school.

Key Foundation Grants have cued up for our application in the spring cycle. We are working to identify "shovel ready" projects where we are hoping to see 1.35M in funding prior to May 2023.

Attended the AFP event – "Meet the Funders" affording OCS the opportunity to present informally our hopes for application and funding. We met with Chris Grunder Of Welfare/Creslea; Vernita Dorsey of WSFS and Nicole Waters of New Castle County.

The Fund-Raising Committee invited members of our community who were involved with the planning and execution of the recent "Under the Stars" mini gala event held recently to participate in a SWOT analysis. This was conducted as a zoom call on Wednesday October 12<sup>th</sup>.

Those attending this call suggested that the event was a success and put forth ideas on how to make the proposed May 2023 event even better.

Chairwoman Georgia Halakos recommended that the committee set as a priority the selection of the next event date as well as research venues that would meet the needs of the event. The October meeting of the Fund Raising Committee is proposed for 4:30 PM on October 25<sup>th</sup>, 2022.

The plan to evaluate and build a team to execute a <u>Health Fair Event</u> in 2023 has gained enough steam to formally add it to the calendar of Fund-Raising Events. The event is proposed as a team Fundraising

Event to raise funds for our Campus Health efforts.

Ongoing efforts for the Brick Campaign – signage at both the lower school and High School will be installed within the next two weeks listing names of committed patrons as well as the installation date for all sold Bricks. The signs will feature QR codes that can be executed up to ten feet away that will allow users to order brick for the flagpole sites.

Installation of Building 22 (Intermediate School) bricks was completed last week, as scheduled)

### Human Resources

Hiring Spec Ed teachers: Consistently working with specialized temporary agencies to identify qualified candidates. (ProCare Therapy, Vovo Vision, Therapy Travelers, ARTC through UD and WilmU to name a few). Interviews continue, several offers have been made and declined due to salary and/or unexpected candidate life events. Interviews scheduled to continue the week of 10/16. Subs are in place under the direction of Manager & EDs.

Quarterly State HR Directors meeting on 10/12; main topic of discussion was staffing issues. State is actively working to assist LEAs in attracting and keeping qualified candidates, through recruiting fairs and focus groups. State Mentoring program is being completely overhauled, expected launch 2023/2024: purpose is to provide solid support to retain educators in Delaware. All LEAs are struggling to find LTS coverage, based on information shared, OCS' substitute pool is solid compared to the majority of schools in the area.

Faculty and staff handbook: draft is ready for Leadership Team & HOS review prior to Board submission. Review & discussion tentatively set for 10/19 SLT meeting.

CBA negotiations will begin approximately Dec 2022, preliminary information has been requested by OCSEA and is being compiled for submission in November.
