The purpose of the CMO grant program is to support charter schools that serve early childhood, elementary school, or secondary school students by providing grant funds to eligible applicants for the replication and expansion of high-quality charter schools.	Yass Grant: This grant we submitted is for Sustainable, Transformational, Outstanding, and Permissionless education, or STOP, for Education. We find out if we advance in early October. The STOP principles are the core qualities that form the heart of the Yass Prize—because they have the power to drive educational change for every child. Opportunity Grant: Senate Bill 56 of the 151st General Assembly codified the Opportunity Fund, an additional source of education funding for Delaware public schools intended to support the increased needs of low income and English learner students. - Planning for Gala 2.0 is underway, targeting May 2023 as a potential date.
- Continuing our partnership with the Philadelphia 76ers, we are finalizing the details on a fundraiser on November 2nd at the game between the 76ers and Washington Wizards. The success of last year's event will be built upon for seamless logistics, varying price points, and an accompanying raffle for the event. The goal is to raise \$10k for school operations.

The following - Submitted by Carl Colantuono

Since our last report we have participated in two Lower School rebranding events.

On August 19th we had a combined event with the PTO that filled the lower school with parents, teachers, and community members. With over one thousand attending – attendees had the opportunity to tour our newly renovated lower school classrooms. This was by all accounts a hugely successful event.

We followed this with a fund-raiser to our extended community with the Under the Stars Fundraiser held September 10th on our grounds under a tent. The evening event did feature a view of a star lit sky, as well as dinner, cocktails, music, and fun. We held an auction featuring a trip for two to Greece for which tickets were sold contributing significantly to the event success as a fundraiser. Jeff Koss has created a preliminary Income and Expense sheet showing a nice profit for this fundraiser which no doubt will be reported separately in this report. (Not stealing Jeffs thunder regarding the net)

The event photographer has released a google file holding all the photos of the event.

We are planning on adding future events like this to our annual fund-raising calendar. To that end the Fund-Raising Committee will be meeting by zoom call on Monday September 26th at 4:30 PM. The only agenda Item will be to conduct a SWOT analysis of the event. We hope to identify our best path forward in planning future events.

Results of the Fund-Raising Committees review of the event will be presented as a committee report at next month's Board Meeting.

Work on the Brick Campaign continues just now including ramped up communications via social

media, email blasts as well as flyers sent home with students, we will soon see signage listing names of sold bricks at the High School and Lower School sites. The Intermediate school bricks are expected to be delivered this week with installation to follow in short order. While all sites will be installed prior to calendar year end there is still time to get a brick for this phase for the High School or Lower School sites.

Time has been invested in interviewing candidates for the approved development department expansion of a single FTE for the department. Preliminary results have been forwarded to the Management team and HR folks for additional action.

Since our last Board Meeting, we have executed plans to engage our major Grant makers in required pre meetings to present our vision and strategy for your next 5years in terms of Capital expenditures.

We met with Thère DuPont of the Longwood Foundation and his staff to review our plan to submit a grant application in the current fall cycle. This presentation took place on September 22nd. Our management along with members of our Board presented our plans. Thère offered point feedback for point regarding recommendations for our submitting a request for 1.25 million with an application that demonstrated 4 or 5 Educational outcomes, this application would need to have detailed bids for the proposed construction projects. He further advised that assuming we had tracked according to our plans we could submit a second grant in the third year for later phases of our proposed work. Upon reviewing our ability to submit the

required detailed bids we have opted to submit our application in the Spring cycle (March). One September 1st we participated in a similar pre meeting with Chris Grundner regarding our presentation proposal for a grant to both Welfare and Creslea Foundations. This pre meeting once again went well and we expect to apply for funding from these two additional foundations. Filing deadline is October 15th. The plan to evaluate and build a team to execute a Health Fair Event in 2023 has gained enough steam to formally add it to the calendar of Fund-Raising Events. The event is proposed as a team FundRaising Event to raise funds for our Campus Health efforts. While much needs to yet happen, we are moving forward with evaluation of team and peer to peer software tools, identification of our Healthcare partners and potential attending vendors lists. We also hope to build a volunteer committee to join our assigned staff members to help conduct the event. We have reviewed the proposed plan with the PTO president in hope of coordinating a walk or run on the same day. The proposed date for the event is April 29th, 2023. While still working to clean up after the UTS event we will be moving to advance the following campaigns and activities as we advance through the fourth quarter. 6-10 students in the current senior class will travel in pairs to different locations throughout the United States in summer 2023. See a map of potential locations by clicking here. Each student ranks their top choices during the application process. During the exchange, each student will stay with a local family of a student who is also participating in AEP. During the 7–10-day exchange, students will experience the culture of the town. At some other point in the summer, a small group of students from another part of the country will visit Delaware. Our participating OCS students would host them for 7-10 days.

Due to substantial funding from major partners like the Ford Foundation and MacArthur Foundation, any student who participates in a weeklong exchange in another part of the country pays nothing. The experience is valued at roughly \$2000.00. It includes flight, excursions, food etc. This means that this opportunity is available to every single OCS senior! Moreover, each host family receives a \$200.00 stipend to offset the cost of gas and food. Our 6-10 OCS students will help plan an itinerary for the group of students being hosted in Delaware in Summer 2023. The average budget for the week is \$3000.00. Odyssey pays nothing.
