Walkthrough Feedback	The school is using walkthroughs to progress monitor major initiatives both in culture and in academics, specifically because culture of the classroom drives academic success.	. Academically the school is implementing systems that promote literacy in all grade levels and across all disciplines. We have adopted the mantra that "we all teach literacy". Research indicates that when students are provided with consistent structures that promote mastery in reading, writing, and comprehension, students are able to become better critical thinkers and problem solvers. In reading, based on the testing data, we have identified target 2 (key ideas) as the area of focus in addition to analysis within and across texts, hence the need to promote cross curricular collaboration with respect to literacy. We are also promoting writing in all	
		subjects as it is a more holistic approach to improving literacy.
