OCS was named 1 of 64 finalists in the nation for the 2023 YASS Prize. Focusing on Sustainable, Transformational, Outstanding and Permissionless education, OCS was recognized for our immersion model we offer to our diverse community. As quarterfinalists, we have already secured \$100,000 and will continue on to potentially win the \$1,000,000 prize.

Financial Update	Local revenue from the districts should be funded at 35% in September. Consolidated Grant voluntary submission completed, funds to likely be loaded in late September, recodes and reallocations to follow. Interest income funds received in Local District Transfers. Odyssey Charter has been awarded \$100k for the YASS Grant. This competitive grant is awarded to schools who demonstrate excellence in education and a commitment to innovation. The grant was written to assist with costs associated with the renovation of Building #27. Debt Service payment processed in August. To-date, \$210k of expenses have been coded to Federal funds out of the budgeted amount of \$1.7mill (increasing to \$2.4mill in Final budget from carryover projects). Projections of a final cash balance will take place after additional data is able to be gathered and provided (unit count, staffing stabilization, etc.).
