
- Head of School Update Elias Pappas
 - The schools are knee deep in test preps, practices, and mini boot camps. We look to assist our students quantify their learning progress in the most accurate way
 - \circ Using iReady and other benchmarks we are identifying gaps to help align our students for the standardized assessments
 - \circ SCG has begun the permitting process toward a June groundbreaking
 - \odot Building 27 contractor design process has begun for the renovations
 - \circ Intent to return surveys have been sent for SY25, with staff planning already started in January
 - \odot Return rates look positive, with a focus on solid growth
 - \circ There will be an 11 week summer camp, for K-5, at OCS, open to the public. This will run until the end of August. This year we are look for 75-100 kids per week.



- \circ OCS Family BBQ will be May 29th more details for follow
- Academic and Arts Showcase will be May 9th
- Rally on the Green, May 16th, some of our middle and high schoolers will represent OCS at the rally for charter schools, including Greek dancers
- Lower and Intermediate School Hrysoula Davis
 - After school activities are expanding with Drama Kids, as well as the Walk/Run Club, and the continued Green Team
 - Growth goals guided with the CIA team and interventionist continue to be adjusted to maximize student growth
 - \odot Students continue to earn Owl of the Month in alignment with our Character Strong SEL Curriculum
 - \circ OCS Health Fair on April 27th and treats with a special person on May 7th
 - Kindergarten Graduation on June 3rd
- Intermediate School Hrysoula Davis
 - \circ The Culture Team is working on establishing new goals for next school year.
 - \circ The students are preparing for the upcoming assessments
 - \odot Band concert on April 30th (5th) and May 1st (4th)
 - \circ Fifth grade graduation on June 4^{th}
- Middle School Adrianne Rodrigues
 - \circ This Friday, MS Pep Rally at The Grail, this is an 8th grade fundraiser and getting them psyched for the upcoming state testing
 - Boot camp test prep the week of April 29th to prepare for the testing, with all the hard work at every level, we will see an increase in scores
 - $\odot\,\text{MS}$ Graduation will be June 4^{th}
- High School Ashley Lipson
 - $_{\odot}$ Junior, Jahi Thomas, has been selected to the Delaware All-State Senior Band
 - PSAT for the OHA and 9th grade was today, nearly wrapping up all testing in the HS
 - $_{\odot}$ Prom is May 2nd, and Graduation on June 1st
 - $\ensuremath{\circ}$ Course advising and selections will complete in the next week
 - \circ OHA Brainstorming sessions will be tomorrow for the end of the year event
 - \circ Incoming OHA students will have an informational dinner on May 1^{st}
- Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment Elias Pappas
 - \circ The academic leadership team will meet bi-weekly through September working on our charter renewal
 - OCS hosted the Delaware Department of Education for their 3rd grade literacy site visit. They met with and visited third grade classrooms, discussed the new reading program, and it was a complete success.
 - \circ Final prep for all the spring testing is complete



- Departments Elias Papas
 - \circ All budget requests were due on April 12th, and the academic leadership team will review and access for the upcoming school year
 - \circ We have hired more drivers recently to replace some departing drivers, be patient at they learn routes
 - \circ We are looking to purchase more buses, details to follow
 - \circ Problem Solving team meetings continue monthly, discussing student needs, supports, and data tracking
 - \odot Learning Leap will run July 9th through August 1st, ½ days, Mon-Thurs
 - \circ We are hiring spec education instructors, and working on adjusting resources
 - IT is finishing the HS door project and the conversion to the Infinite Campus
 - \circ Food Services is in the HUC event at Holy Trinity and they will provide "fresh greens and herbs" from our gardens
 - Annual Appeal is ready to be sent, the goal is to address the \$3 million dollars OCS pays for our facilities
 - $\circ\, {\rm Out}$ of State Travel
 - $\circ \quad 3^{rd} \, grade \, to \, Philly Zoo \, on \, May \, 1^{st}$
 - $\circ~~5^{th}$ grade to the Franklin Institute, on May 28^{th}
 - Motion to approve the travel as presented. KP 1st and EA 2nd Approved unanimously
 - Dr Lekkakou, May 31st June 3rd, to Boston for the 10 Summer University
 - Motion to approve Dr Lekkakou's travel. BD 1st and EJ 2nd Approved unanimously
- Greek Program Ioanna Lekkakou
 - The Greek American schools in the US traveled to Greece to discuss education.
 Five of the six schools were present, and other governmental ministers were interested in our program. We met for 3 hours with parliamentary leaders, including the Greek Vice President. Our immersion program was the stand out, and generated much interest among all attendees. We gained an advantage in our visibility within Greece. We have ministry contacts now, so we can discuss more interactions with their departments. We expect this support to also aid in getting our Greek teachers visa approvals more quickly.
 - Tenth Summer University is a 4 day event starting May 28th. Participants from universities and Greek dignitaries. Dr. Lekkakou will speak on Saturday about our immersion program, highlighting the dual language education model.



- Met with the DOE to discuss having a state test for Greek, in addition to Spanish and Mandarin. We will pilot the test in the end of May with the 6th grade immersion
- \circ Interviewing applicants from Greece to get the best of the best for OCS
- General discussion about out of state travel
 - \circ Condition of the probation or should it continue? Thresholds, or consent agenda? \circ We will look into it
- Financial Report Jeff Koss
 - \circ Monthly finance report March
 - Revenues are \$47.6 million with 103.6% collected
 - Substitute expense are rising higher than expected, but salaries are reduced due to attrition
 - o Golf fundraiser is underway
 - SCG approved exploratory plans, we may have challenges with storm water retention and crosswalks
 - No field construction until June, pending permitting
 - \circ $\;$ Aiming for Aug 12th for one field to play on, lights and bleachers later $\;$
 - New sign will go up this month
 - Build 27 contractor completed their walkthrough
 - o HS entrance project nearly complete, elevator shaft work in May
 - Motion to approve March monthly web report. KP 1st and EA 2nd Approved unanimously
 - Turf Field change order III
 - o Addition of safety netting around baseball and softball fields
 - o Reduction of field shape, which reduces turf costs
 - This will not adjust our loan amounts
 - Motion to approve the change order to add safety netting between fields 1 & 2 at cost of \$120k and to change the shape of the turf fields, reducing the turf costs by \$72k. KP 1ST EA 2nd
 - Approved unanimously
 - Bus Purchase
 - Expand the bus fleet by two 2024 units with A/C, with \$142k per bus
 - Financing will be through Santander Bank with roughly 5.9% for 5 years
 - Investigating purchase of 10 passenger vans, through state auctions, which could be included in the Santander Ioan
 - Motion to approve the deposit of \$1,000 toward the purchase of 2 new busses, and locking the rate, for \$142k per bus with Santander Bank. KP 1st and EA 2nd


